The Berwickshire Naturalists' Club

The Club was founded in 1831 and has a membership of around 300.

The main emphasis of the Club's activities is on antiquities and local history expressed by five field meetings a year between May and September to places of interest between the Forth and the Tyne where an expert usually gives a talk and helps to show members round. Such places include historic private houses not open to the public. In addition there are usually two extra meetings of a botanical or ornithological nature.

There are also two indoor meetings when talks are given. The President of the Club gives the 'Anniversary Address' at the Annual General Meeting in October and an 'Autumn Lecture', usually on a natural history topic, is given in November.

The Club publishes a journal once a year, the *History*, which includes papers on a wider range of subjects than the field meetings including archaeology, cultural history and natural history. The authors are mainly Club members and the papers are at a refreshingly varied level of expertise.
